First, the delegation visited the hydrogen filling station at Stuttgarter Straßenbahnen AG (SSB). The Indian representatives were welcomed by Markus Wiedemann, Head of the Motor Vehicles Division. After the tour of the hydrogen filling station, a special trip in the hydrogen bus to MAHLE International GmbH followed.

After lunch with Dr. Marco Warth, VP Global Product Development, Holger Oechslen, Head of Systems Development and Rainer Schulze Temming, Head of Engineering Powertrain Product Testing, a plant tour at the hydrogen test center followed. The last stop on the agenda was Robert Bosch GmbH. Through the artist talk on stage, the audience gained an impression of who the three Indian artists are and what inspires them to create art. This was followed by the performance of an Indian dance group consisting of the dancers Shany Mathew and Sri PT Narendran. Andreas Lapp then opened the buffet and a relaxed get-together with live Indian music by Dr Balakrishna and Karthik Raman followed, which successfully rounded off the evening.

The artist Reena Bhatt presented artworks from her art series "Incredible-India" and selected pieces from her Buddha collection. The "Incredible India" collection featured paintings that focus on elegance, rich colours, and attention to detail. In her "Confluence" art series, artist Poonam Kamath made a remarkable connection between German culture and traditional Indian art forms. In this way, she aims to pay tribute to both cultures to which she belongs. Artist Supriya Savant inspired with traditional Indian folk art on canvas as well as on everyday objects. Fascinating was the extremely fine technique she uses on her art pieces – true to her motto: "Life is my canvas and my motivation for painting."

19TH INDIAN FILM FESTIVAL IN STUTTGART

The 19th Indian Film Festival Stuttgart took place from July 20th – 24th, 2022 at the Innenstadt Kinos in Stuttgart. Organizer was the Filmbüro Baden-Württemberg under the direction of festival director Oliver Mahn, sponsored by the state of Baden-Württemberg, the state capital Stuttgart, and the Stuttgart-based company LAPP.

Festival director Oliver Mahn opened the 19th Indian Film Festival together with the promoters and sponsors in the festive Marble Hall of the New Palace in Stuttgart. In addition, the Indian film journalist Uma da Cunha from Mumbai was honoured with the Staufer Medal of the State of Baden-Württemberg, which was presented by State Secretary Sandra Boser. Among the numerous guests were also film guests from India and the USA. The opening film "Shankar's Fairies" by Irfana Majumdar, was shown at the

Gloria Kino in Hindi with English subtitles. A total of 30 recent feature films, short films, documentaries, and animated films from across India were screened. Among other things, the films addressed various social, economic, and political grievances in India and gave viewers an insight into India's current issues.

At the festival finale, various film awards were presented to the winners from the categories of best feature film, best documentary, and best short film. As the favourite of the festival audience, the short film "Bad Egg" by Mehak Jamal received the audience award. Honorary Consul Andreas Lapp presented the prestigious film award "German Star of India" to director Sandeep Kumar for his performance on the socially critical film "Mehrunisa".

CLASSICAL MUSIC IN THE MONASTERY BENEFIT CONCERTS

"The whole world is sky blue"

Since 2006, international artists as well as young talents have been singing and making music at Klassik im Kloster (Classical music in the monastery) in Bad Herrenalb. On July 21st, 2022, in the presence of Honorary Consul Andreas Lapp, the multifaceted concert series celebrated its 50th anniversary concert with an operetta gala entitled "The whole world is sky blue." What began seventeen years ago with a concert in the monastery church of Bad Herrenalb has developed into a brand whose concept, with 50 concerts, 43 artists from thirteen countries and the unbelievable number of over 2,000 young talents, has been able to generate total donations of over 55,000 euros for social projects. On the anniversary evening alone, proceeds of 7.834,00 euros were donated to Alexandra Nowack and the "Indian Rainbow" association to support 31 children in the Indian state of Assam in northern India, who are cared for and educated by Catholic Fatima Sisters.

With a colourful bouquet of lively operetta melodies, the artists Frazan Adil Kotwal (baritone), Yi Tashiro (piano) and Emmanuelle Chimento (soprano), who study together at the Stuttgart University of Music, impressed the audience. Frazan Adil Kotwal comes from Mumbai /India. He is the first and so far, only Indian opera singer to study in Germany and has not only found a congenial partner in his piano accompanist Yi Tashiro from Japan, but also harmonizes brilliantly with Emmanuelle Chimento from France. "Today our soul is being caressed," Andreas Lapp emphasized in his welcoming words and directed his thanks to Sabine Zoller, who has been organizing her summer concerts in cooperation with the Honorary Consulate of India since 2017.

Since their premiere in 2017, the India Summer Days in Karlsruhe have been one of the largest India festivals in Germany. With free admission, they will again present themselves in 2023 parallel to the "Fest", one of the largest open-air events in Germany, giving special space to the long-standing and strong German-Indian partnership in Baden-Württemberg. In addition to the three-day stage programme with dance, live music and authentic shows, visitors will have the opportunity to actively participate in special offers.

"Thanks to the support of our strong partners, we can offer an authentic and varied Indian programme" says Martin Wacker, Managing Director of the organising KME Karlsruhe Marketing und Event GmbH. At the India Summer Days – under the patronage of Prime Minister Winfried Kretschmann – and in partnership with the Indian Consulate General in Munich and the Honorary Consulate of the Republic of India in Stuttgart, there are offers from all areas of life in India, so that visitors can gain insights and make their own experiences.

It is important to the organisers that everything can be presented in Karlsruhe, tradition and modernity of Indian culture, which at the same time can be experienced by visitors in an authentic way. In addition to an extensive cultural programme, the focus will also be on participatory yoga, for example. This also includes tasting the culture, among other things through chai, spices and Indian specialities. At the stands, there will be spices, body painting with henna, clothes and textiles, small arts, singing bowls, incense, jewellery, pictures, books and decorative material, as well as information on Indian culture and many tourist tips.

The German-Indian Round Table was opened by Honorary Consul Andreas Lapp. The speaker Dr.-Ing. Vinod Talgeri is managing director of the company TALGERI CONSULTING, a provider of consulting services for European and Asian governments and corporations. He wrote his doctoral thesis on outsourcing issues at the Fraunhofer Institute for Production Technology. In addition, he has held performance positions in various international industrial and IT companies, where he was responsible for areas such as management, sales

"MAKE IN INDIA MITTELSTAND!" ROADSHOW IN STUTTGART ON OCTOBER 7TH, 2022 M∷M

After years of corona-induced moratorium, the "Make in India Mittelstand!" roadshows have started again this year. These are organized under the leadership of the Indian Embassy in Berlin by Rödl & Partner as the official Partner. Especially in times when, for example, rising energy prices, geopolitical challenges and corona-related supply chain bottlenecks are forcing German SMEs (small and medium-sized enterprises) to explore alternative investment strategies, it is worth taking a look at India. It was precisely this view of India's potential that the MIIM roadshows clearly demonstrated to the participants.

The roadshow in Stuttgart made the start on October 7th, 2022. This was organized in cooperation with the Honorary Consulate of India in Stuttgart at the headquarters of the company LAPP and was attended by several company representatives from different industries. In addition to the interesting keynote speech by the Indian Ambassador, Mr. Parvathaneni Harish, which covered topics such

as (renewable) energy, digitalization and India's demographic potential, the event was also characterized by the interesting exchange of practical experiences in the context of a lively panel discussion. In this, Ambassador Parvathaneni Harish, Honorary Consul Andreas Lapp, and Martin Wörlein of Rödl & Partner, moderated by Rahul Oza, Rödl & Partner, shared their practical experiences and perspective on India's potential with the attending representatives of German SMEs (small and medium-sized enterprises). The program was rounded off by a presentation of the "Make in India Mittelstand!" program and the many ways in which it can help German SMEs set up or expand operations in India. This part of the program also gave the opportunity to answer individual questions of the company representatives and thus led to a lively exchange. The roadshow was rounded off by 'networking and snacks' and thus offered a nice opportunity for individual exchange in a smaller group.

Return Visit of Bhartiya Public School, Sikar, Rajasthan at Friedrich-Schiller-Gymnasium, Ludwigsburg after Covid-19

Ulrich von Sanden, principal of the Friedrich-Schiller-Gymnasium Ludwigsburg:

What a difference two years make! More than two years have passed since I had the privilege to visit Bhartiya Public School in Sikar, Rajasthan, which has been our Indian partner school for a decade now. My family and I and our entire exchange group, consisting of the two teachers Angelika Hoff and Ute Sievert and 14 students, were treated like kings in a breath-taking display of exuberant Indian hospitality. Colourful and dazzling receptions at school, delicious meals in the families' homes and a multitude of trips to places of cultural interest offered plenty of opportunities for intercultural exchange and discussions. All this

left us with feelings of deep gratitude and the necessity to offer similar experiences to our Indian partners on their return visit to Germany.

Unfortunately, due to Covid-19, our school had to wait more than two years for our Indian students to visit Ludwigsburg. This meant that many of the original exchange partners had already left with the Abitur in their pockets, new host families had to be found and prices had risen tremendously due to inflation. However, it also meant the experience of sudden helpfulness, be it from our "new" host families or the Indian Honorary Consul, Mr Andreas Lapp, to whom we would like to express our sincere gratitude. I am extremely relieved and happy that our exchange with Bhartiya Public School has survived two years of pandemic, thanks to great commitment on the Indian as well as the German side.

On this festive day, the Rabindranath Tagore Culture Prize, which went to Jose Punnamparambil, was also awarded. This prize is awarded every two years in cooperation with the DIG. It honours especially German-speaking authors and cultural personalities who have the talent to bring the meaning and beauty of India to a German audience. The "India Speech" by Bernhard Steinrücke successfully rounded off the festive event.
